

This information sheet has been designed for Lambton Social Service Worker Diploma Program graduates who would like to be considered for admission to Year 3 of the 4-year Bachelor of Social Work under approved Articulation Agreements.

STEP 1: APPLY

Make an application to Year 3 of Social Work through the OUAC (Ontario Universities Application Centre) at ouac.on.ca/105 by March 1.

Using the OUAC application, a request can be made to send mid-year Lambton transcripts to King's electronically. Please watch for the prompts and carefully note the timelines for sending transcripts.

STEP 2: SUBMIT DOCUMENTS

- Your mid-year Lambton transcript (unless requested through OUAC application previously)
- Your final high school transcript
- Any other documents requested in support of your application

STEP 3: OBTAIN LETTER OF ENDORSEMENT

to request a letter of endorsement from Lambton. The email must include your name and Lambton student number.

The letter of endorsement will be sent after final Lambton grades have been posted.



Admission Requirements

- Graduate Lambton's 2-year Social Service Worker program;
- Completion of a prescribed set of courses with the Social Service Worker Diploma program within the two years immediately prior to applying;
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5;
- No grade less than "C" (or 2.0 GPA);
- Letter of Endorsement from the Coordinator of the Social Service Worker Program

STEP 4: APPLY TO THE SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK

To be considered for admission to Year 3 in the Bachelor of Social Work, you must complete a formal application by March 15. Further information and instructions about how to apply can be found at socialwork.kings.uwo.ca/bsw/bsw-admissions-guide.

FAQ's - Frequently Asked Questions

How many transfer credits will I receive?

If you have been admitted to the BSW through this pathway, you will receive 7.5 full course equivalents. Students need to have completed 10.0 full course equivalents prior to their registration into Year 3 of the BSW degree. Students in this pathway will need to complete 2.5 courses in the May-July term prior to their September registration.

What if I don't want to apply using the pathway? Can I apply for an alternate degree program?

Yes, students are able to pursue degree options in other disciplines if they wish (i.e., Sociology, Psychology, Disability Studies etc.). The maximum transfer credit for students not planning to apply through the BSW pathway will be 5.0 courses. To be eligible for admission with this transfer credit, students must have achieved a final overall average of 3.0 (B) on their diploma.

How do I register for the required Summer courses?

You need to apply to King's first through the OUAC and receive admission. This will allow us to create a summer line of registration for you and we will be able to assist you with enrolling into the courses. Summer term registration begins the first week in March on a first-come, first-serve basis so students wishing to apply through this pathway will need to apply early to ensure they get the courses they would like/need during the summer term.
