Dr. Jeff Chang is Associate Professor in the Graduate Centre for Applied Psychology, Athabasca University, where he is director of the Master of Counselling program. Jeff is a Registered Psychologist (AB) and Clinical Fellow and Approved Supervisor in the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy. Over thirty years, Jeff has worked in children's mental health, employee assistance programs, and private practice, and with families embroiled in high-conflict separation and divorce for twenty-two of them. He publishes in the areas of high conflict divorce, clinical supervision, child and family therapy, and school-based counselling. Jeff's current practice focuses on high conflict divorce. He provides clinical supervision at Calgary Family Therapy Centre and to Provisional Registered Psychologists. Jeff is the editor of the Canadian School Counselling Review.
